COMMUNITY	COUNTY	CDBG AMOUNT	LOCAL MATCH	DESCRIPTION
Corunna City	Shiawassee	\$600,000	\$650,000 (52% match)	Sanitary sewer relining, manhole, rehabilitation and removal of improper sewer connections. Needed to replace deteriorated sewer lines through the city.
Millington Village	Tuscola	\$152,500	\$200,500 (56% match)	Replace sewer lift station and clean existing lagoons. Current lift station is aging and becoming nonfunctional. Entire village uses the sewer system.
Rosebush Village	Isabella	\$140,000	\$69,900 (33% match)	Improvements to existing lagoons, including sludge removal to upgrade the 33 year old system. Improvements will provide reliability and capacity for added usage.
Bangor City	Van Buren	\$145,804	\$44,196	Replace approximately 4 blocks of road and sidewalks in downtown. Upgrade sewer to cease flooding and reduce potholes.
North Branch Village	Lapeer	\$132,801	\$35,456 (21% match)	Sewer lift station and forcemain. Allows for the diversion of sewage to the new lagoon. The entire village will benefit from the new sewer improvements.
Owendale Village	Huron	\$424,400	\$75,000	Downtown main street and streetscape. Includes lighting, park benches, landscaping and trash cans. Entire village uses the downtown and main street.
Big Rapids City	Mecosta	\$698,250	\$299,250 (30% match)	Loop water system for increased reliability and pressure as recommended by DEQ. Includes 7000 linear feet of water main.
Calumet Village	Houghton	\$353,745	\$300,000 (46% match)	Replace 3000 square yards of deteriorating brick & 750 linear feet of storm sewer on 5th Street in downtown. MEDC helped fund 6th Street improvements in 2002. Calumet is a Mainstreet Community.
Fowlerville Village	Livingston	\$282,458	\$282,461 (50% match)	Replace existing deteriorated and obsolete water, storm and sanitary sewer lines on Grand Avenue - which is the only main route to downtown Fowlerville.
Grayling City	Crawford	\$168,360	\$42,097 (20% match)	Replace two undersized water mains that cross the AuSable River per a DEQ request. This will increase the reliability of the entire city water system.
Manistique City	Schoolcraft	\$579,351	\$300,000 (34% match)	Replace 3040 linear feet of road, 1720 linear feet of water main and 2440 linear feet of sewer in the downtown for improved travel and infrastructure needs in downtown.
Seney Township	Schoolcraft	\$346,481	\$1,870,000 (84% match) includes USDA	Construct a new wastewater collection facility to replace existing individual septic systems and the localized community drainfield system that fail due to flat terrain and high water level.
White Cloud City	Newaygo	\$400,000	\$598,740 (60% match)	Road and streetscape improvements in downtown. Upgrade water main to improve reliability and pressure. MDOT also committed approximately \$400,000 to project.
Gaylord City	Otsego	\$344,300	\$100,000 (22% match)	Replace a failing and seriously undersized municipal water supply well including a pump, well house and 300 feet of water main, telemetry and control systems.
Kalkaska Village	Kalkaska	\$1,000,000	\$440,000 (30% match)	Construct iron removal plants at the village's 4 wells. The plants will remove the bad odor & rusty color from the village's water supply caused by high iron levels.
Kingsley Village	Gd.Traverse	\$972,400	\$243,100 (20% match)	Construct a 200,000 gallon water storage tank and 6000 linear feet of main because the existing tank is at capacity due to population increase. Will increase water capacity/pressure/fire protection.
Republic Township	Marquette	\$360,000	\$40,000 (10% match)	Replace a 1964 deteriorating metal ground water storage tank with a new 300,000 gallon concrete ground water storage tank. Improvements will increase reliability and improve water quality.
Albion City	Calhoun	\$228,690	\$63,910 (22% match)	Replace existing floating digester cover and make major concrete repairs to the primary digester in order to maintain the viability of the city's wastewater treatment operation.
Manistee City	Manistee	\$250,000	\$50,000 (17% match)	Street mill and resurface to a main access route within city which serves as the main route for residents of a large senior apartment complex and a senior housing facility.
Masonville Township	Delta	\$750,000	\$4,701,792 (86% match)	Construction of a wastewater collection system in conjunction with USDA to serve township residents.
